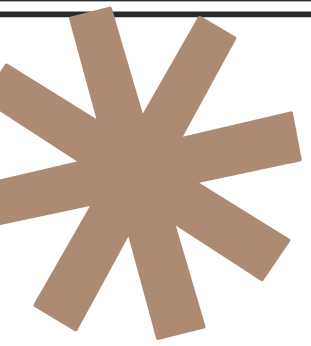

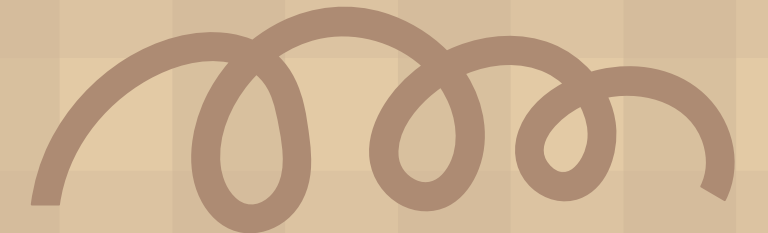

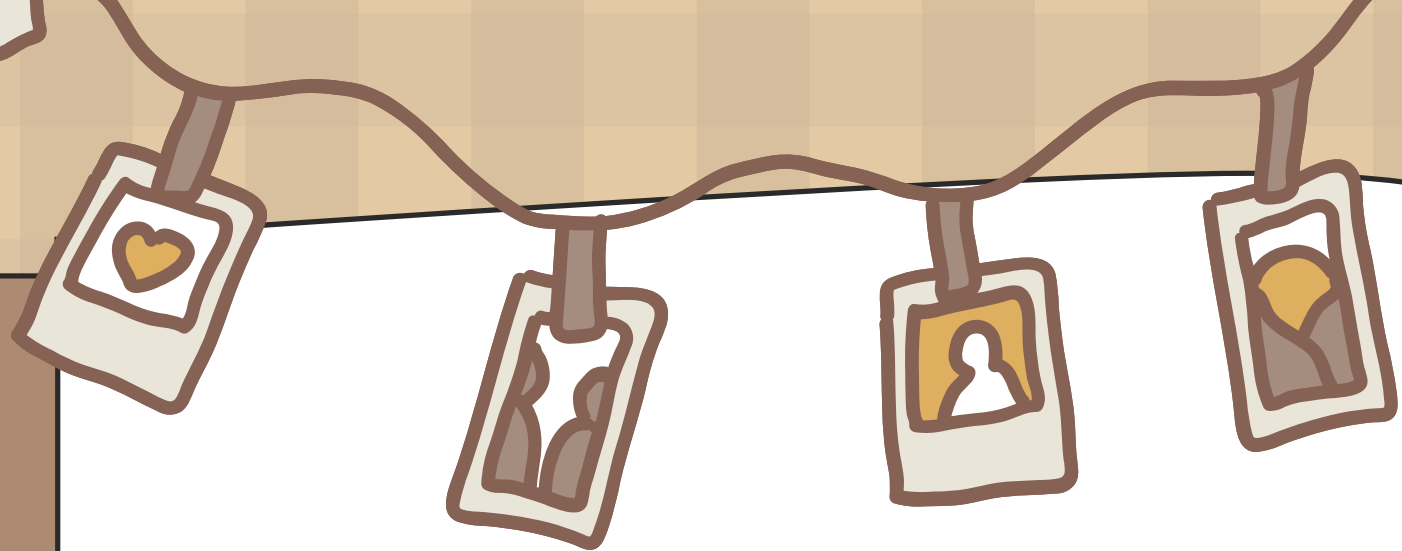

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is so important to the success your child achieves at school. All parents/carers have a legal responsibility to ensure their child regularly attends school. When a child attends school on a regular basis, they take an important step towards reaching their full potential, and are given the greatest opportunity to learn new things and develop their skills. Children who miss school can frequently fall behind with their work and do less well in exams. The more time a child spends around other children, whether in the classroom or as part of a school team or club, the more chance they have of making friends and feeling included, boosting social skills, confidence and self-esteem.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE MATTERS

ATTENDANCE

The table below shows that any drop in attendance results in lots of time in school being missed.

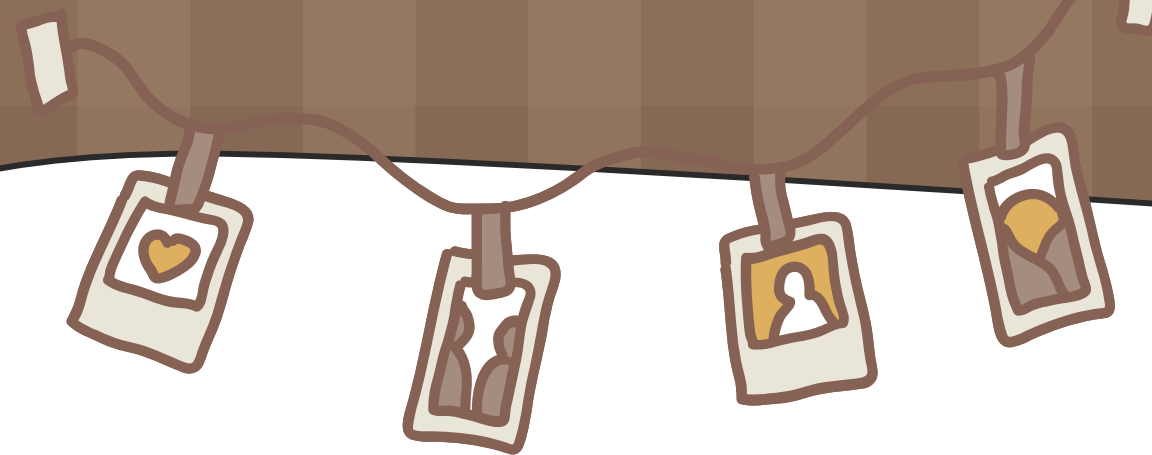
This is the same with lateness, where being 5 minutes late a day results in losing 3 whole school days a year. 30 minutes a day is the same as 19 days of school lost per year.

Improving attendance at Ringland is one of our priorities and we will be working with families to support this. The Education Welfare Service work with us to ensure children are attending school and we work closely with Ffion Marasco, our Education Welfare Officer. We meet together regularly to check our registers and will discuss any pupils with whom we have any concerns about.



ATTENDANCE

We aim to work together with families to support attendance being improved for all children. Our priority is having the children in school as regularly as possible, so we can help them learn and enjoy engaging in their learning.

If there appears to be no genuine reason for regular periods of absence and attendance does not improve, the Educational Welfare Service will seek to prosecute.

The Local Education Authority can issue a Fixed Penalty Notice for unauthorised absence. A fixed penalty notice can be given for a student who has 20 unauthorised absences from school. This includes holiday absence and persistent lateness. This is not a situation we want to happen and would rather work with our families but we also have to understand that school attendance is a legal responsibility.

SCHOOL MEALS

Chartwells are our school meal provider. The menu for children is shared regularly, via text, as it is updated by our provider, Chartwells.

Every child in Newport, up to Year 6, is entitled to a free school meal. Meals are booked in school, with the children choosing their preferred option.

Families can still get additional support for school costs, via the School Essentials Grant. Information about this can be found [here](#). We offer support in completing forms in relation to this as it can lead to additional support for children in school. Please contact us if you think you might be eligible.



HEALTHY SCHOOLS

At Ringland, we operate a Healthy Schools Policy, which can be found [here](#). Every child up to Year 2 gets free milk, daily. We also encourage children to make healthy choices, provide fruit and vegetables to encourage them to try new foods and also ensure that our offering around Physical Exercise supports children in this.





BREAKFAST CLUB

We run a daily 'Breakfast Club', where the children can access a free breakfast at school, from 8.30am each morning. If you are interested in your child attending, please contact the office for a form. This is a scheme funded by the Welsh Government.



LEARNING & TEACHING

Learning and teaching is at the heart of everything we do, here at Ringland. We work, as part of Professional Learning, to continually develop as a team. Our priorities are set out in our School Improvement plan, which identifies areas we are working to develop further and shows how we are doing this.



We root all of our decisions in how to best improve the children's learning and take pride in the way we engage, support, nurture and develop children to achieve their potential.

All staff here work towards this goal and are committed to becoming the best school we can possibly be, for the benefit of the children of Ringland.



CURRICULUM

We continually reflect on our curriculum, as part of our Curriculum Design process. This enables us to respond to the children's need and develop an exciting, authentic and engaging curriculum, which leads children towards the Four Purposes of Curriculum for Wales.

Curriculum for Wales is a purpose-led curriculum, aiming to support children to become:

- ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives
- Enterprising, creative contributors, ready to play a full part in life and work
- Ethically, informed citizens, ready to take part in life in Wales and the world
- healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead a fulfilling lives as a valued member of society.

CURRICULUM

Curriculum for Wales has six Areas of Learning and Experience, which are:

- Mathematics and Numeracy
- Science and Technology

As part of these Areas of Learning and Experience, staff plan responsively to children's needs, in a way which they can progressively build their knowledge, skills and experiences.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES



Staff offer a range of Extra Curricular activities, which change regularly and cover a number of year groups and areas of learning. We communicate these with families termly.

CHARGING, SCHOOL TRIPS & PERMISSIONS



All education during school hours is free. We do not charge for any activity undertaken as part of the curriculum.

Occasionally, we may have visitors to school which we ask for a contribution towards the cost of. Our Charging and Lettings Policy can be accessed [here](#).

We do however understand the impact of additional costs and try to keep these to a minimum. Costs are always carefully considered when arranging school trips and other activities.



We ask all families to sign a permission form to allow for visits in the locality (we always let you know if children are leaving site) and for any trips further afield, permission will be requested on each individual occasion.

ADDITIONAL LEARNING NEEDS (ALN)

We are determined to deliver a fully inclusive education for all children at Ringland Primary School. We support children identified as having Additional Learning Needs through a range of strategies and approaches. There are various stages of need moving from Universal to One Page Profiles (with or without targets) and on to School-based Individual Development Plans and Local Authority-based Individual Development Plans. There is currently ongoing reform with ALN in Wales; a useful parent guide can be accessed [here](#).



We pride ourselves in the support we offer to all children, and particularly those with ALN. If you have any concerns, or want to meet with us around this, please contact the office and ask for our ALNCo, Miss Bishop.

SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding is our top priority, at Ringland. Keeping children safe is central to everything we do. Mr Prewett is our Designated Safeguarding Officer, with Mrs Robertson-Stannett and Miss Bishop being Deputy Designated Safeguarding Officers. Our Governor responsible for Safeguarding is Mrs J. Woodley, our Chair of Governors.

We take site security very seriously and therefore all entrances to school are secured throughout the day. Families who need to access the school will do so via the main reception.

Visitors to site have to sign in and wear visitor badges, so everyone is aware they are permitted on site.

Dogs are not permitted within the school grounds or inside the building and families are kindly asked not to bring dogs onto the school premises.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

SCHOOL UNIFORM

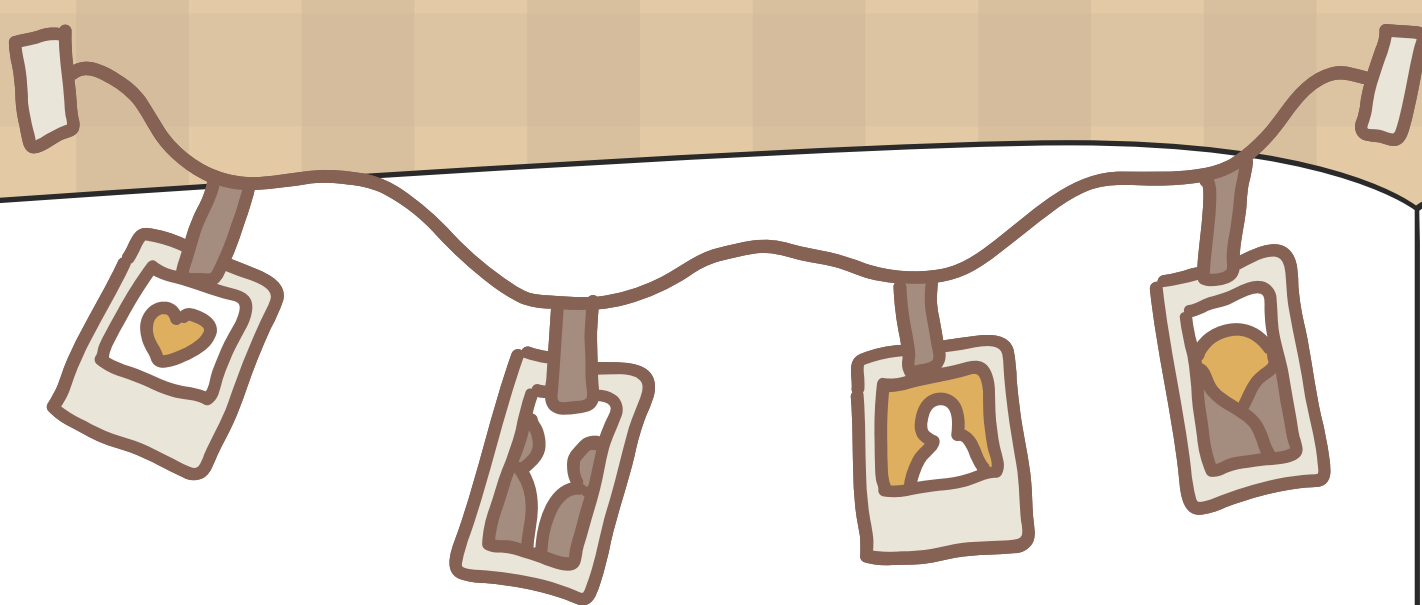

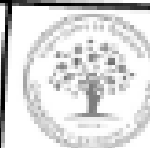


RELATIONSHIPS & BEHAVIOUR

EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY

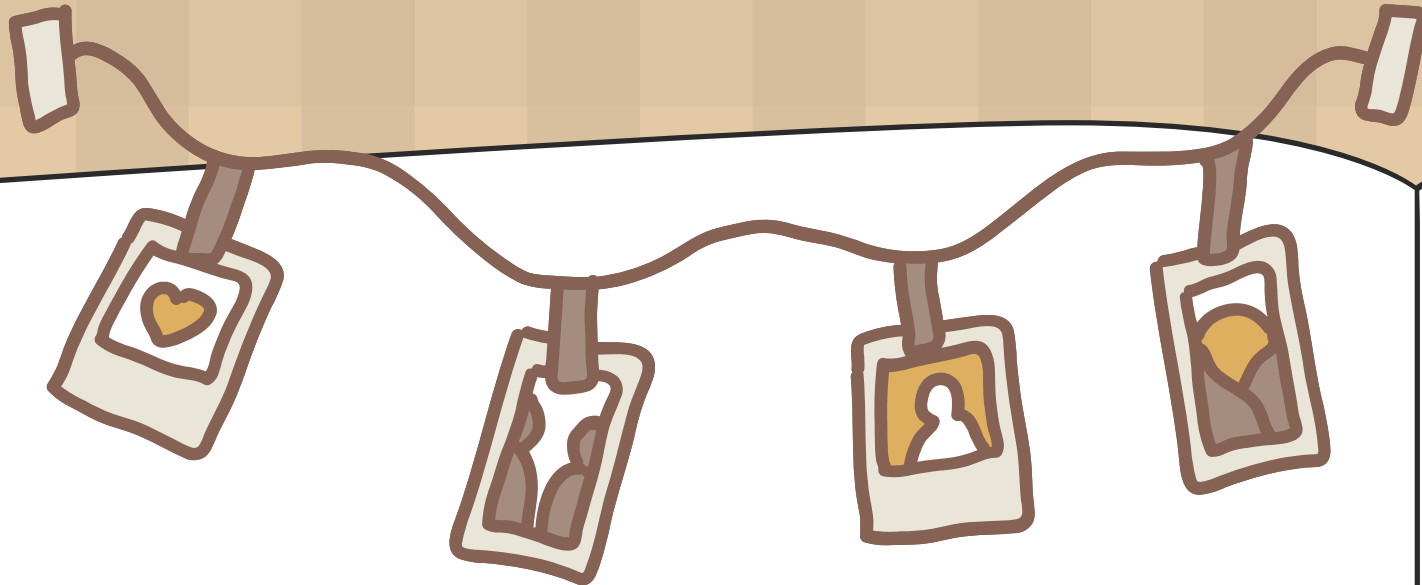

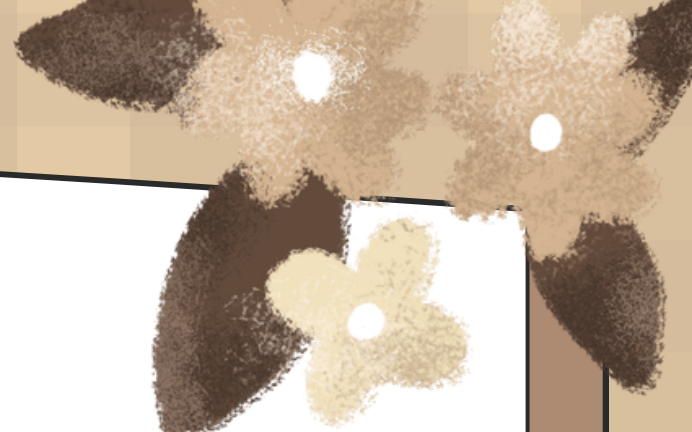


RELATIONSHIPS AND SEXUALITY EDUCATION



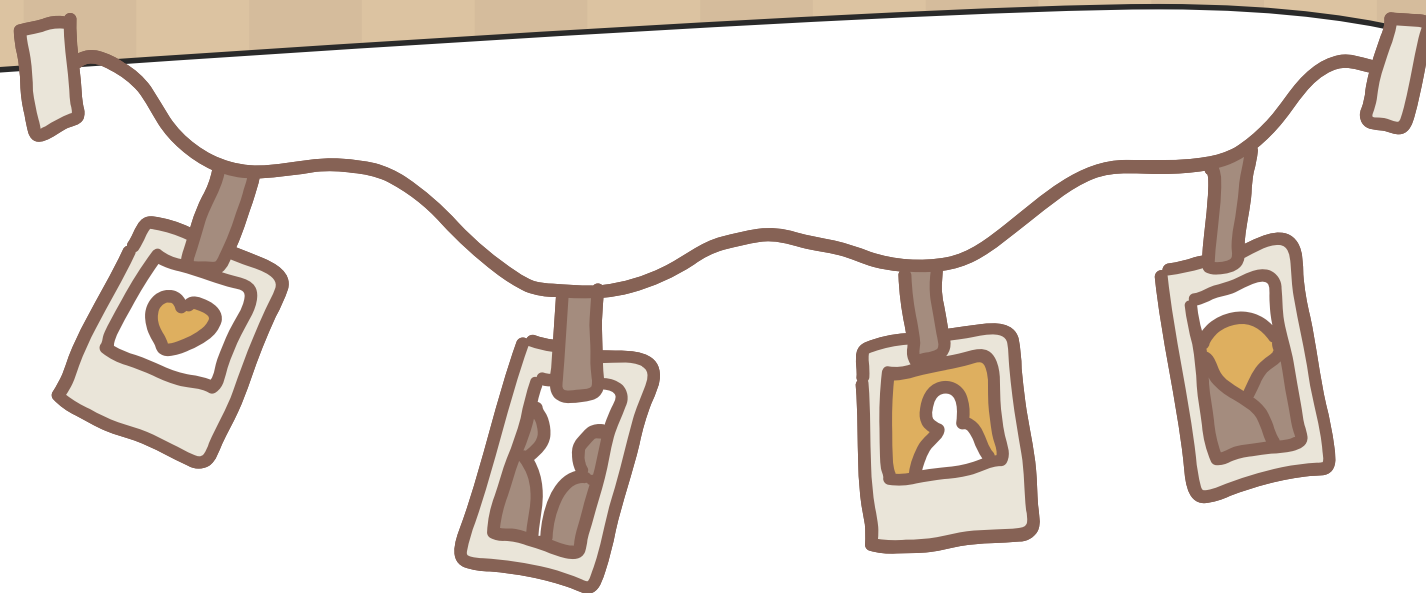
At Ringland, we ensure well-being is central to our approach and this is supported through utilising carefully mapped learning, through Jigsaw.

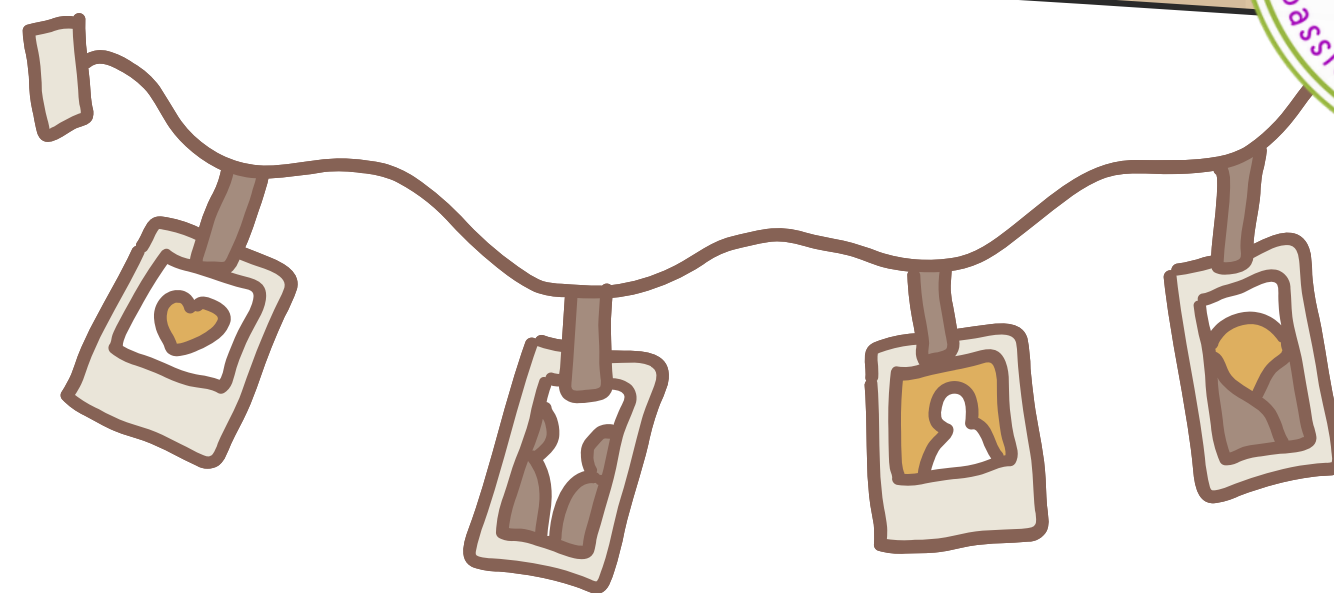


REPORTING & COMPLAINTS

SCHOOL PERFORMANCE DATA

Historically, schools reported on their performance by sharing data annually, with families. This is no longer the case and our approach is to have a much better dialogue with families around individual children and progress. Progress is regularly reviewed, with every child being discussed termly with our Headteacher, Mr Prewett.
